BEING ENFORCED AS OF JULY 1ST

Taken from Lifejackets (Maritime Safety Queensland)

A lifejacket is a vital piece of safety equipment that could save your life. The best idea is to make sure you wear it. Put the lifejacket on as part of your pre-trip preparation. It is a lot harder to put a lifejacket on in the water during an emergency.

Lifejacket rules

New lifejacket rules starting from 1 December 2024

Lifejackets are compulsory:

- when alone or accompanied only by children under 12 years in an open boat less than 4.8m in length and underway.
- during the crossing of a designated coastal bar in an open boat, as well as in any open area of a boat of any length, and on certain craft.
- while boating between sunset and sunrise in an open boat less than 4.8m in length and underway. children aged over one year and under 12 years must wear a lifejacket when on an open boat or in the open area of a boat of any length while it's underway.

Specific craft requirements as of 1 December 2024

You must wear a lifejacket when crossing a designated coastal bar in the following types of craft:

- small sail boats (funboats, lasers, herons)
- pedal boats
- rafts (including inflatable rafts)
- rowboats (excluding those operated by Surf Life Saving Australia Clubs)
- sea and surf kayaks.

Note: this requirement does not apply to users of:

- body or boogie boards
- surf boards
- wind surfers
- kite surfers
- stand-up paddle boards.

You will note, our next social event is on the 26th July. This includes an "Open Day" in the morning. Leading up to the date, we will be advertising this through local social media platforms.





Booking Officer's Report

Hi All,

Well winter is nearly upon us, the best time of the year to visit the Club (my opinion), so make a booking, grab some firewood and enjoy a mini break at the Anchorage.

Our "esteemed" newsletter editor recently appointed himself "Officer in charge of facilities management", this position apparently requires the testing of club equipment which was fully functional prior to the inspection and subsequently deeming it faulty post inspection, as a result of this "testing" we had 3 non-operational generators a significant issue with our shower pressure pump and a motor vehicle which was no longer fit for purpose. Fortunately, some of us have plenty of excess time on our hands so I was given the opportunity to spend a few days at the club, much of it soaking in oil, grease, diesel and bore water. Craig took on the ute repairs and reports that it is now fully functional and the keys have been relocated for use by "responsible" committee only. We thank the new facilities manager for bringing these issues to our attention.

(Look, there's a lot to unpack here... But, if I can summarize by saying, "SHUT UP KEVIN! -ed.)

We will soon be replacing the fire alarms in the cabins with new Fire / Co2 alarms, they have a 10 year non-replaceable battery installed. These things can be somewhat annoying when they trigger, however, they are there for your safety, a long stick is provided in each cabin to reach the hush button. If for some reason you are unable to reset it, as a last resort only remove the alarm, put it in the lost property box and most importantly let me know. Please do not remove them just because the camp fire is triggering an alarm, maybe consider selecting a firepit based on the wind direction. Safety is the highest priority.

A few reminders:

In the *summer newsletter*, I made mention of some changes in the booking process to assist the treasurer in allocating revenue correctly, unfortunately only a few members have followed this new process, can I please ask that you read the below information and include the Treasurer in all emails relating to bookings, non-members etc. David's job is the most challenging of all the committee positions so your help with this is very much appreciated (3)

<u>Cabin Bookings</u> (From the Summer edition)

After some discussion with our treasurer, it is apparent that we need to have a more consistent approach to the way we manage cabin bookings, the treasurer is required to assign all payments appropriately, this requires information such as cabins booked, dates, number of non-members etc, currently, in many cases a lump sum is deposited and David needs to make a best guess of how to allocate the funds, which in some cases is very time consuming.

Booking process (updated)

Over next few months we will move to an email only booking model, this is already the case in 90% of bookings. Please provide:

Cabins required
Date in / Date out / Number of nights
Number of non-members

Once booking is confirmed please make payment the week prior to your stay.

Payment confirmation should be attached to the original booking email and sent to gcbcbookingofficer@gmail.com AND gcbctreasurer@yahoo.com.au

Codes will be issued once payment is received.

Many members already follow the above process which is greatly appreciated, anyone needing assistance or clarification should contact myself or David.

Assistant Secretary's Report

Heading Towards Sixty

The Early Years

On 31st May, 2026, the Gold Coast Boat Club will be officially sixty years old. Some key dates and events in the past have been :

May 3, 1966 A Steering Committee met at the home of Mr Sam Davidson and after

discussion of infrastructure and type, they formed a club whose name and

constitution was to be decided on a later date.

June 14, 1966 The First Annual General Meeting was held and the name "Southport Outboard

Cruising Club" was selected from a choice of 16 proposed names for the new club. Also thirteen members

of the Steering Committee became the first Office Holders of the Club.

January 1967: Commodore Dick Bennett impressed on members that there was a need for a clubhouse, land and

facilities which needed member involvement. During that first year, log races, skiing, safaris, overnight camping and exploration of various rivers as well as a Manly to Southport power boat race all

took place.

1967/ 1968: First newsletter was produced, President was renamed Commodore, twenty one preplanned social

events took place including fishing competitions, log events, seafaris, BBQs and picnic days and

Christmas parties for adults and children.

March 1, 1968: A thirty-year lease on a parcel of land on South Stradbroke Island (the current Anchhorage) was

granted. It was signed by Stewart Taylor, Trevor Mundell and Ray Maddin as trustees.

1968/1969: The 'Club land at Tippler's Passage' was cleared of undergrowth and tables and seats were built. A

major fundraiser was a Saturday stall outside the BCC store in Southport with homemade goods

and donated 'garage sale' items

Dec 29, 1976: A full page of the Gold Coast Bulletin shows the various activities on Christmas Day over at the An-

chorage. 250 adults and 180 children crammed into the lease. Not long after, a ceiling of 200

members was called for.

February 1970: The name of the Southport Outboard Cruising Club was officially changed to the Gold Coast Boat

Club

1972: A "day shelter " was built near the beach, with four tin walls and a roof over a concrete slab. Later

it was subdivided into 4 little rooms and beds were added.

1978 / 1979: Boat stickers indicating a member to be financial, were made and used for the first time. A new

Briggs and Stratten 3KVA generator was commissioned to run the lights.

GCBC Fishing Competition 2025

How to Enter:

- 1. Catch a fish in any of the listed species, and make sure to get a clear photo of you and your catch in front of the recent club sticker, as well as on a brag mat/next to a tape measure (so we can verify the size). We will also have a club brag mat we will keep behind the bar in the Day Shed shortly, for anyone wanting to call in and take some photos at the club. Please clean off if used.
- 2. Send the photo to me, the Fishing Captain, either to steve.t.langfeldt@gmail.com or 0400 797 392 with your name, the species, length, and date.
- 3. You can enter as many fish as you like throughout the year, but only the longest fish for each species will count. It's as easy as that!

 I'll keep track of the leaderboard, and we'll post updates every newsletter, so everyone knows where they stand.

Prizes:

The longest fish of each species will win a prize for both junior (up to 16yrs) and senior anglers (from 16yrs and up) and the overall longest fish of the year will take home the grand prize!

Prizes are to be announced at a later date.

Winners:

The winners will be announced at our Christmas Party 2025, and as usual, we'll wrap up the year with a big celebration. Make sure to join us for the BBQ, drinks, and a chance to toast the year's best catches!

Some Quick Rules:

- · Only fish caught from legal fishing areas and during legal fishing times count.
- · The 2 photos required must be clear. The first one needs to show the full fish with the brag mat or tape measure next to it to verify the length. The second photo to be of you holding your catch with your club sticker in the background so there are no continuity discrepancies.
- · Please remember to fish responsibly handle fish carefully and follow local regulations.

This is all about fun, friendly competition, and getting out there and enjoying our beautiful Gold Coast waters. I'm excited to see what everyone catches over the next year, and I'll be sure to keep the leaderboard updated.



Broadwater Parklands Floating Walkways Upgrade and Boat Ramp Repair

Gold Coast Waterways Authority is upgrading the boating facility at the Broadwater Parklands

Three floating walkways and abutments, along with the damaged existing cast-in-situ slabs of the boat ramp will be replaced and upgraded.

During the construction works, the boat ramp will remain partially open to minimise disruption for users.

BENEFITS

- Support safe access for recreational vessel owners that utilise our waterways.
- Replace the floating walkway pontoons to address the listing issues caused by original design and construction materials.
- Replace the upper cast-in-situ sections of the dual-lane boat ramp to address severe cracking and maintain facility usability.

IMPACTS

 Partial closure of the boat ramp and pontoons during construction works, including on weekends.


